

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

CLASS REPS

CAMPUS REPS





ELECTRONIC DEVICES

PRINTING AND COPYING

Paper Cut is used to manage all network printing
Every print job that you submit is analysed and charged according to: number of pages, size, colour, duplex.

Your ID card is your prepaid account (\$20 initial credit per year) tied to your student user code, which must be topped up in order to continue printing.

Selected MFDs (Multi-Function Devices or otherwise known as Copiers) around campus have student ID card swipe units installed for student photocopying. Scanning documents to be sent to your student email account and is FREE to use from these same selected MFDs.

You can top up your prepaid account, and make further enquires about printing and photocopying at any of the following locations:
